SHOW RULES

ENTRIES

- This is an official ARBA & TRBA Sanctioned Show & will be governed by the latest show rules.
- Entries must be entered online by **March 15, 2025**. This includes all rabbits, cavies, and banquet tickets. No late entries will be accepted. **Deadline will be strictly enforced.**
- Animal entry signifies acceptance of show rules which will be available in the showroom. TRBA State Show Entry Link is available on the TRBA Web Site <http://www.trba.net>.
- All Saturday/Sunday-only exhibitors must check in with show secretary's office no later than 7:00 a.m. March 22nd. Building will open 6:00am.
- Substitutions will be allowed by email at no charge and must be received by Tuesday March 19th 8pm - **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Substitutions after this time will be limited to Ear changes only AT THE SHOW and at \$1.50 each.
- Completed Youth Royalty contest application with one 4 x 6 photo must be emailed by February 28th, to youthco.texasrba@gmail.com. Individual youth contestants (not entered in royalty) must be registered by March 14th to youthco.texasrba@gmail.com. Forms and additional information available in this catalog.

OWNERSHIP

- All rabbits/cavies must be owned by the exhibitor a minimum of thirty (30) days prior to exhibition.
- Any animal owned by an adult or an adult with a youth MAY NOT be entered in the youth show.
- All rabbits must be clearly and permanently earmarked in the left ear. All cavies must be earmarked by a tattoo or ear tag in the left ear. This rule will be strictly enforced. Judges will be reminded to disqualify animals with illegible tattoos.
- No animals may be entered in both the Open and Youth (age 5 through 18) show.
- **Due to youth contests, TRBA does not require youth exhibitors to carry youth animals to the tables.**

GENERAL

- Any rabbit/cavy showing signs of sickness or disease will be removed from the showroom and will not be judged. Entry fee will be forfeited
- All rabbits must meet minimum breed standard weight. **NO DOES WITH LITTERS.**
- This is an Early Entry carrying cage show and rabbits must be in leak proof carriers.
- **No animals other than rabbits, cavies and SERVICE ANIMALS will be allowed in the show building.**
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to get the animal to the judging table. Animals will be called three (3) times and if not present will be scratched with no refunds.
- Judges decisions will be final. No harassing of any judge will be allowed.
- The TRBA Show Committee reserves the right to make any changes necessary, including substitution, addition or deletion of any judge.
- Only rented and TRBA sponsored booths will be allowed to set-up in the building. Sale of any type merchandise or any other items will not be allowed unless booth space has been approved and rented. No raffles other than those sponsored by TRBA will be allowed.
- **NO COOLERS, COFFEE POTS, FOOD, ETC. WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BUILDING. IF YOU BRING ANY OF THESE TYPES OF ITEMS INTO THE BUILDING, YOU WILL BE SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION AS DETERMINED BY THE SHOW COMMITTEE AND TRBA BOARD.**
- The TRBA and Cadence Bank Center will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
- The Fire Department has asked that we maintain aisles in case of an emergency.

Texas Disability Law – Service Animals

Excerpts below taken from: https://gov.texas.gov/organization/disabilities/assistance_animals

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Title II & Title III

- Under the ADA, Title II and III, a service animal must be a dog (or miniature horse) that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability. Service animals can be professionally trained or trained by the handler themselves.
- Under Title II and Title III, a service animal handler does not need to provide certification for their service animal.
- Title I of the ADA, regarding employment, does not specifically address service animals in the workplace. Under Title I, a service animal may be a reasonable accommodation. As such, professional written verification may be requested by an employer when it is not obvious that the animal is a service animal.
- A comfort or emotional support animal is NOT trained. Comfort animals do not have rights under the ADA. For example, businesses do not have the legal obligation to admit a comfort animal if there is a “no pets” policy, as under the ADA these animals are in essence “pets.”

Texas Health & Safety Code

If a service animal is accompanied by a person whose disability is not readily apparent, for purposes of admittance to a food service establishment, retail food store, or physical space occupied by another entity, a staff member of the establishment, store, or entity may only inquire about:

- Whether the service animal is required because the person has a disability; and
- what type of work the service animal is trained to perform.

“Service animal” in this context means a canine that is specially trained or equipped to help a person with a disability. An animal that provides only comfort or emotional support to a person is not a service animal. The tasks that a service animal may perform in order to help a person with a disability are directly related to the person's disability.

BASIC FORMATTING

FONT: Several most popular (and readable) fonts include: Arial, Calibri, Tahoma, Times New Roman and Verdana. Using one of these will help make the application more readable.

FONT SIZE: Business standards, as well as these contests, use 10-point or 12-point type.

PAGE MARGINGS: Margins should be between ½inch and 1½inches, with the most common size being 1 inch.

STYLE: The indiscriminate use and overuse of font styles (bold, italic, underline, etc.) serves to diminish your writing. Some use can be helpful, but be careful only to use it when necessary.

QUESTIONS: Make sure you copy the question above your answer. It reminds the scorers of what you have been asked.

SCORING

SCORING: There will be two royalty graders for each division. They are provided with a rubric modeled after the points spread of ARBA royalty and are informed to provide constructive feedback. Please remember that the applications are one component of the royalty contest. The grand total score of all components determines the Royalty winner.

This information is presented in order for applicants to take best advantage of the application platform to express themselves and their project. This is not an all-inclusive list of tips, nor is it intended to be a list of requirements, though some of these tips are designed to help applicants understand the specific requirements necessary to create a fair and manageable contest.

APPLICATION TIPS

DEADLINES: Pay attention to deadlines. Late applications will sabotage your effort.

SUBMITTING APPLICATIONS: Do not send your applications in any format other than PDF. The photo should be a separate attachment.

READ THE QUESTIONS: Make sure you answer the question asked! You can talk about other things as well, but the most common error is not answering the questions asked.

CLARITY: Be clear and concise. Answer the question fully, but do not rely on an unnecessary volume of words to make the point that you want to make just to fill up space for an answer to one of the questions you have been asked, like this tip is doing! Don't use two lines if only one is needed.

GRAMMAR: Using good grammar and spelling tells the judge you are serious and careful. Ask a teacher or other adult to help you proofread your application.

ORDER OF QUESTIONS: Occasionally, the order of questions will change from year to year. Make sure you use the current year's questions. It is always helpful to start with your application from last year, but make sure you properly edit for the current year.

PHOTOS: Pictures tell a lot about you and your project. Select them carefully and size them appropriately to tell the story. Include captions so the judges know what they are looking at and why. However, not all answers will lend themselves to being helped by a picture. Concise use of pictures can be just as important as concise use of language. *Remember to include a self-portrait (similar to a school photo) that is a component of your score and will be included on royalty posters.*

ACCURATE INFORMATION: Honesty is, as always, the best policy. Be mindful of the fact that scorers, while remaining anonymous, may be able to verify the claims made in your application. You do not want to get caught embellishing your activities or accomplishments.

The ARBA Official Breed ID Guide (found on ARBA website) is used to score.

Written Test (All ages)

Examination questions will be drawn from the ARBA Official Guidebook to Raising Better Rabbits and Cavies, the ARBA Yearbook, ARBA Standard of Perfection, current issues of the Domestic Rabbit magazine and current issues of the TRBA News. Questions are in multiple choice, true/false, matching, and short-answer formats.

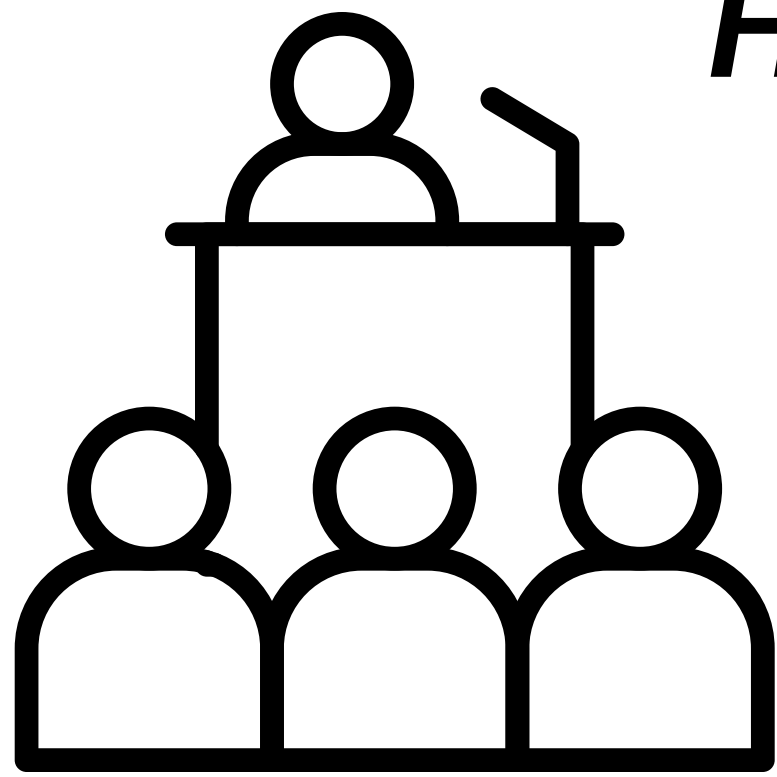

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I have to be an ARBA/TRBA Member to enter the show?

No. Being a member of the American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) and Texas Rabbit Breeders Association (TRBA) provides benefits such as participating in sweepstakes points contests. However, it is not a requirement to enter the show.

My breed isn't listed as sanctioned. Can I still show?

Yes. All breeds recognized by the ARBA (or have ARBA Certificates of Development) may be shown. Sanctioned breeds allow exhibitors that are members of the breed's National Organizations to be eligible for sweepstakes points based on the placements at the show. TRBA will send show reports to the National Breed Clubs.

Will there be an ARBA Registrar present?

Yes.

What is the barn environment?

The show will be held in the Exposition Building. The 55,000sf building features a concrete floor, large fans, strong ventilation system, permanent sound system, state of the art lighting, and is air-conditioned. Ample restrooms are available. Parking is free.

May I leave my animals in the barn overnight?

On Friday & Saturday evenings. The building must be vacated at the conclusion of BIS on Sunday.

Is there a hotel block?

No. There are many different hotels available close to the show barn. You should be able to find one that will best fit all your requirements. The venue website lists some nearby recommendations that you can look into.

Is a health certificate required?

As of this catalog date, Texas does not require health certificates for entry. Exhibitors are to consult their current state regulations for any rabbit travel restrictions prior to departure.

What is a fur class?

This is an optional class judged at the conclusion of the breed based only on fur. The animal must be entered in the breed class to enter fur. National breed clubs offer a fur sweepstakes. This is open to all recognized ARBA breeds.

Other questions?
